THE UNITED STATES' UNOPPOSED MOTION TO STAY PROCEEDINGS

On November 22, 2016, the United States filed an unopposed motion to stay proceedings in this case pending a final decision by the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit in *Land of Lincoln Mutual Health Ins. Co. v. United States*, No. 17-1244 (Fed. Cir.). Docket No. 6. The Court denied that motion, without prejudice, on December 2, 2016. Docket No. 10. The Court stated, "Either party may renew a motion for stay after the government answers or files its response to plaintiff's complaint." *Id.* On March 1, 2017, the United States filed a motion to dismiss. Docket No. 16. The United States hereby renews its prior motion and respectfully moves the Court to stay this action pending a final decision by the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit in *Land of Lincoln Mutual Health Ins. Co. v. United States*, No. 17-1244 (Fed. Cir.). Counsel for Plaintiff Blue Cross of Idaho Health Service, Inc. has consented to this renewed request.
